

## Colour Range

Selection Preview: – this displays on your image.

Selection OR Image: – determines how the ‘preview image’ is displayed.

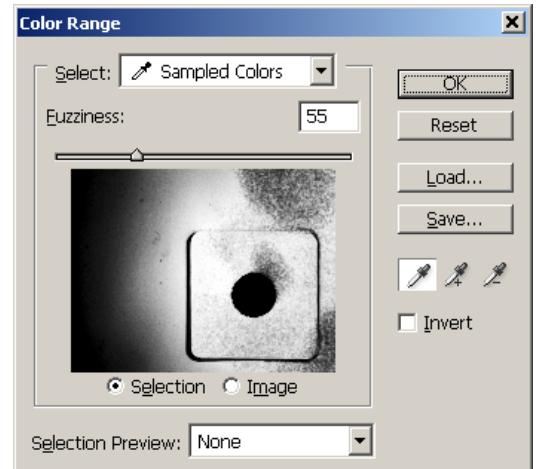
Select: – determines what colour is used for selection.  
The ‘Eye Droppers’ – are used to pick the ‘colour used’ from your image.

Fuzziness: - determines how much is selected.

Invert: - used to select the OPPOSITE

(can also INVERT your selection by choosing [Select] then [Inverse]).

NOTE: by pressing [Alt] the ‘Cancel’ button is changed to ‘Reset’



## Modifying a Selection

After making your selection

(marching ants showing on your image)

press the ‘Edit in Quick Mask Mode’ button (or press Q).

The NON-selected area will be shown coloured

this can be changed by selecting the Brush tool & painting either in BLACK or WHITE.

When you have completed your ‘editing’ you can return to

The selection view either by pressing the ‘Edit in Standard Mode’ Button (or press Q again).



## Layer Masks

Open BOTH your images in Photoshop.

Make your image to be ‘inserted’ ACTIVE

Drag this ‘layer’ onto your other image

this will become the TOP layer (the one you will see).

Your image will be in the lower ‘Background layer’.

Now duplicate your ‘Background layer’  
(this will show as ‘Background copy’) &

drag this to become the TOP layer.

Now select the area you DO NOT want to be hidden

always select the simplest subject & use INVERT if required...

When you are happy with your selection just ADD a layer mask (by default it uses the selection) & if you want to modify it – select the ‘layer mask thumbnail’ & by using the brush tool either paint with BLACK or WHITE.
